This summer, Newcastle Art Gallery will present a major exhibition, JOHN OLSEN: The City's Son. To celebrate we invite students to participate in a unique art experience and recreate the Hunter River as a temporary art installation in Civic Park.

ABOUT THE EXHIBITION

The Australian artist. John Olsen. OBE. AO. was born in Newcastle in 1928. Olsen considers himself a Novocastrian and in 2016 he returns home to curate an exhibition that captures the essence of his birthplace. JOHN OLSEN: The City's Son, features works personally chosen by the artist that reflect his affection

for Newcastle and the Hunter region's waterways; the beaches, harbour, lake, river and wetlands.

In Civic Park, students will recreate the Hunter River as a temporary art installation using a mixture of materials. A colourful, vibrant, immersive installation will be developed throughout the day.

LEARN MORE ABOUT THE HUNTER RIVER

The evolution of the Hunter River stretches back millions of years.

Originally called Coal River by European explorers, the Hunter River winds through the lands of the Wonnarua, feeding into the home of the Awabakal clan of Muloobinba (Newcastle) who lived around the harbour and foreshores.

The Port of Newcastle, which runs from Kooragang and Carrington to Nobbys headland and Stockton has a rich 217 year history of commercial shipping. Coal remains its biggest cargo, alongside 24 other cargo types, including wheat, fertiliser, fuels and cruise ships.



🛞 FUN FACTS ABOUT THE PORT OF NEWCASTLE

- 217 years of commercial shipping
- 2,167 ship visits in 2015
- 20 operational berths
- Main channel depth of 15.2 metres
- World's largest coal export port
- Awabakal people lived in the area and referred to Newcastle as Muloonbinba (place of edible sea fern)
- Largest ship to enter the harbour was the *Celebrity Solstice* cruise ship at 317 metres in length!
